during an interview, either big or small, that may be a bit outside of the norm—such as oversharing personal information or talking negatively about a past job/manager.

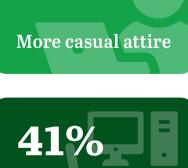
Company cultures are becoming more casual to comfort in the workplace.

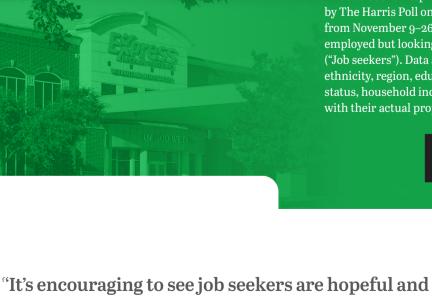
