Top Growing Occupations

- 25% growth in home health and personal care aides, totaling 924,000 new jobs
- Restaurant cooks projected to grow by 37%, with 459,000 new roles
- 370,600 new jobs for software developers, a 26% growth
- 8% growth in fast food workers, 243,200 new jobs
- 7% growth in general and operations managers, 209,800 new jobs

Job growth between 2021 and 2031 is expected to be 5.3% in general.

Educational Considerations

As of 2017, 36% of jobs require a high school diploma or GED.

22% of jobs require no formal education.

Only 2.5% of jobs require a doctoral or professional degree.

Canadian jobs projected to see growth between 2020 – 2030 are:

- Graphic designers, specialist physicians, registered nurses and psychiatric nurses, and technical sales in wholesale trades.

On average it takes 5.4 years of earning to recoup your investment in an associate degree, with a lifetime return of 1,201%.

Over the last 10 years, college costs have gone up about 2% each year.
